



ISPRS TRAVEL GRANT RECEIVER REPORT GEOSPATIAL WEEK 2019 (Enschede, The Netherlands, 9-12/06/2019)



This month I had the honour of being awarded by the ISPRS Foundation (TIF) a travel grant to join the Geospatial Week 2019, held in Enschede from the 9th to the 14th of June. When I applied for this grant, I was in the phase of applying for the admission at the PhD programme in Architectural and Landscape Heritage at my home University, Politecnico di Torino, and I thought it would have been a great opportunity to receive support from ISPRS; apart from the privilege of being sponsored from a reference institution in my research field, receiving this support helped me in covering part of my travel expenses.

At the conference I held an oral presentation for the contribute titled "360° Images for UAV Multisensor Data Fusion: First tests and results", which is now published in the Archives of the International Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing. I wrote this paper together with my colleagues Lorenzo Teppati Losè

and Davide Einaudi, and my supervisor Prof. Filiberto Chiabrando. This work represents for us the arrival point of months on hard work, in which I tried to gain as much expertise as possible from my elder colleagues, more expert than me on the topic of the presented research. Submitting this contribute helped me in gaining a higher score during the evaluation process of the PhD position I had applied for: I were finally selected, and I am now enrolled at the doctoral school of Architectural and Landscape Heritage in Turin.

During the days of the conference I had the opportunity of meet dear and esteemed colleagues from other university, who are currently working on my field of research or on complementary fields. I believe that such kind of events can be the right opportunity to discover interesting people for potential collaboration in future works. I had also the opportunity to meet again old friends, already met during the ISPRS TC II Symposium 2018 held in Riva del Garda last year.

I had an amazing impression about the conference: the sessions were very well scheduled, and I had the opportunity to follow some interesting presentations. Having the possibility to present the work with an oral presentation was for sure the biggest benefit I gain from the travel grant, I also received a good feedback by some of the organizers of UAV-g, which I hereby would like to thanks. I would finally like to send my regards to Professor John Trinder, who attended my presentation, and the commission that selected me for this award.

Thank you again for your precious support, that was definitely a big help for giving visibility to my research.
