

Announcement of an open permanent position at the
Department of Geodesy and Geoinformation
Faculty of Mathematics and Geoinformation, Technische Universität Wien

Full Professorship in "Geoinformation"

The applicant is expected to have outstanding academic credentials and an excellent track record of scientific accomplishments in a modern area in the field of Geoinformation, and shall have experience with the collection, modelling, processing, and storage of diverse spatial data sets, connecting physical world phenomena with social and legal processes. The successful candidate will be expected to make a significant contribution to the institute's research output, to provide leadership for researchers and postgraduate students, and to organise and carry out teaching in the fields of geoinformation, land administration and cadastre. Special consideration will be given to applicants who have the ability and willingness to establish collaborations with institutions working in related fields of research and to those who have a demonstrated ability to attract external project funding.

Knowledge of German is not a precondition; however, we expect a successful candidate to acquire a working knowledge of German.

The applicant must meet the following requirements: A completed academic degree in the field under consideration, an outstanding academic track record in research and teaching, pedagogic and didactic skills, leadership abilities and international working experience in the field of research.

University professors belong to grade A1 of the Austrian Collective Agreement for University Staff and receive a minimum salary of EUR 66.953,60 per year. Any higher salary agreement will be negotiated individually with the successful candidate, commensurate with qualifications and relevant experience.

The Technische Universität Wien is committed to increasing female employment in leading scientist positions. Qualified female applicants are encouraged to apply and will be given preference when equally qualified.

Handicapped persons with appropriate qualifications are also expressly encouraged to apply.

Applications including a detailed curriculum vitae, description of scientific objectives, list of publications and copies of the five most outstanding publications of the applicant should be sent to the Dean of the Faculty of Mathematics and Geoinformation, Wiedner Hauptstraße 8-10, 1040 Vienna, Austria.
