The anticipated start date for this position is July 1, 2019. The successful applicant must have a PhD at the time of appointment.

We seek an energetic and dynamic scholar with demonstrated potential for leadership and international recognition in the study of geomatics and physical geography. Preference will be given to candidates with research backgrounds in scholarship that is theoretically rich or methodologically advanced, but also has ready application in physical geography that complements the Department. We are particularly interested in applicants whose research and teaching interests connect with the current strengths in the Department of Geography and Environmental Management including, but not limited to, Geomatics, Earth System Science and Climate Change and Environment. A demonstrated ability to forge and sustain fruitful partnerships with scholars from a variety of disciplines is considered an asset.

The successful candidate will be expected to develop a strong research program, teach at the undergraduate and graduate level, contribute service to the Department and supervise graduate students. S/he will be appointed as a regular member of the Faculty in the Department of Geography and Environmental Management.

The successful candidate will have obtained a PhD in Geography or an equivalent discipline and will be an outstanding emerging scholar with a demonstrated potential to achieve a significant international reputation in the next five to ten years. The University of Waterloo understands the impact that legitimate career interruptions can have on a candidate's record of research achievement and encourages potential candidates to explain in their application the impact this may have on their record.
