Method Description for the Potsdam 2D Semantic Labeling Contest

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In this work, we use ResNet101 as our baseline model. To classify small objects such as cars, we employed atrous convolution for dense feature extraction and field-of-view enlargement, which is inspired by DeepLab.

During training, we only use the RGB images of Potsdam offered by the organizer, no any other data. We perform multi-scale and flipped patches as data augmentation to get more information from the original images. Also, we use "poly" learning strategy for training rather than fixed learning rate.
