The participation include the presentation of my paper which is accepted for oral presentation and publication in the ISPRS Annals of the Photogrammetry, Remote Sensing and Spatial Information Sciences (ISPRS Annals).

On the second day, May 8, the parallel sessions continued. The program started at 8 AM. Four parallel sessions at four venues were scheduled. The sessions ended at around 3:30 PM. The next activity is the Poster Session which lasted until 5 PM. Almost a hundred posters were presented and the participants viewed and asked questions during the said session.

In the morning of the third day, May 9, I presented my paper under the session on 'Agriculture and Natural Ecosystems Modelling and Monitoring'. The presentation is titled 'Estimation of Mangrove Forest Aboveground Biomass using Multispectral Bands, Vegetation Indices and Biophysical Variables Derived from Optical Satellite Imageries: RapidEye, PlanetScope and Sentinel-2'. During the last day, the session started at 8:30 with some parallel presentations. The Closing program was held at around 3:30 PM. Certificates of participations were given to the participants. I took my flight back to Manila on May 11, 2018.
